

## **GREENS MEETING – WEDNESDAY, JUNE 9<sup>th</sup>, 2010**

### SUMMARY OF NEW EVENTS:

- 1- The committee was brought up to date by Barbara of the recent events.
- 2- Barbara and Scott along with Joe Mottle and other board members rode the three golf courses to see the progress that has been made since the transition.
- 3- It was noted that the Champ course was in the most need of improvement: bunkers have no sand, many sparse areas along the greens and the rough.
- 4- The Palmer is in decent shape as it has not been overseeded.
- 5- The Haig has shown improvement where the sod has been planted. However, it still needs work.
- 6- The Squire was closed for maintenance so we didn't ride the Squire.
- 7- The Estates is v
- 8- In very good condition but the greens are slow.
- 9- Joe Mottle (chairman of the board) wrote a letter to management about the conditions of the golf courses and our disappointment with the Champ.
- 10- We were informed on Friday that John Anderson has resigned as Head Greens Keeper.
- 11- As of now the Superintendents of each golf course will remain in charge until a new Greens Keeper is hired.

### UPDATES OF GOLF COURSES:

- 1- CHAMP: Weak going into overseeding
  - A. Carts will be allowed ONLY in the Rough Temporarily because fairway hasn't completely transitioned.
  - B. When a tournament is played on the Champ it should be written in the signed contract that the divots will be filled in after play.
  - C. Fringe has been cut around the greens
  - D. Greens need to be rolled more often.
- 2- SQUIRE: Cart paths need maintenance work to repair pot holes.
  - A. Drainage issue on the fifth hole is being repaired as the non-native vegetation on that hole is being cleared.
  - B. Bunkers have a lot of shells and that has to be worked on.
- 3- PALMER
  - A. Fairways and rough is growing in nicely.
  - B. Greens are still healing and are bumpy: need to be rolled.
- 4- HAIG: Cart paths need maintenance work to repair pot holes.
- 5- ESTATES: Closing this week for maintenance.

OVERVIEW: The courses are coming along slowly but more work has to be done, including rolling the greens and getting the bunkers in better shape.

Resumes are coming in for the new position of Greens Keeper and the maintenance schedule for the fall is on hold until someone is hired.
